

Thank you for choosing to use an Access Key for Kew Traffic School. This customised accessibility guide provides convenient information about accessing this venue. Access Keys are universally designed and suitable for all people, regardless of ability.

KEW TRAFFIC SCHOOL

For your Access Key to be successful, we recommend you follow these guidelines:

- Access Keys are available online to help you prepare for your visit in advance.
- Access Keys to be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.
- Access Keys can be read independently or shared with a friend, family member, carer or support worker to prepare for the visit.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, help the participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.
- If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.
- Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.

- Safety information is located on page 22.










































Did you know?

Getting There

Kew Traffic School is located at 374 Cotham Road, Kew (on the corner of Grange Road).

See Google Maps.

Train

The Alamein, Belgrave and Lilydale lines will get you there. The nearest railway station is Camberwell Station, 2km from the school.

Bus

The nearest bus stop, on the corner of Cotham and Normanby Roads, is 380 metres from the school. Use bus routes 302, 624 or 304.

Tram

The nearest tram stop is directly outside Kew Traffic School on Cotham Road. The number 109 tram will get you there.

Parking

We have a designated carpark on-site for visitors. Entry to the carpark is via Grange Road.

There is:

- one accessible parking bay located 16 metres from the main entry gate
- three-hour general parking
- two-hour parking on surrounding streets
- bus parking on Grange Road.

Physical Wellbeing


- Helps to improve sensory awareness and exploration of the world around.
- Helps to improve fine motor skills and coordination.
- · Helps to train the sense of spatial awareness.
- Helps to develop gross motor skills.
- Helps to develop balance and core strength.
- Improves cardiovascular health.

- · Improves overall mental health and wellbeing.
- Improves proprioception- Combine this with the spatial awareness point above.
- Promotes more confident bike riding.
- Promotes improvements in range of movement.
- Reduces pain and inflammation.
- Reduces stiffness.

- Encourages children to socialise and practise turn taking.
- Encourages collaborative, cooperative play as well as teamwork.
- Encourages responsible decision making.

Staff

Staff wear casual clothes with a coloured Boroondara lanyard and name badge.









Toilets

Kew Traffic School has two sets of public toilets.

Set One

Location: Next to the education room, on the right.

Includes:

- one unisex, accessible toilet with sensor lighting
- manual door opening inward. Door clearance of 850mm. Twist lock at 1080mm AFFL
- cubicle space 3412mm x 2120mm
- · grab bars to the right and behind toilet
- colour contrasted toilet seat at height 470mm AFFL with right hand transfer
- toilet with backrest
- sink height 790mm AFFL with lever tap 960mm AFFL
- baby change area within accessible toilet.

Separate unisex ambulant toilet.









Set Two

Location: Next to the education room, on the left.

Separate male and female toilets (one of each).

Education Room

The education room is located through the entry gates to the right.

THE KEW TRAFFIC SCHOOL

Entry is through a manual door opening inward with a clearance of 990mm. Another door can be opened to increase the clearance to 1600mm.

The education room is used for Safety Education sessions for schools, kindergartens and childcare centres. These sessions occur before children ride on the track.

Includes:

- chairs with back and armrests
- cushions for children to sit on
- road signs on the wall
- pigeon holes with dress ups and traffic education resources.


Feel Change in ground surface Heating/Cooling Shared personal space

Safety Education Programs

The Safety Education Programs are designed to help children learn about road and bike safety.

The programs are aligned with the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework and the F-10 Curriculum, and are aimed at school, kindergarten or childcare groups aged from 3-10 years.

Sessions are capped at 30 children.

Resources and a risk assessment is provided before each session. Information is gathered regarding children who have additional needs and what their requirements may be.

Bicycles with and without training wheels are provided.

Prior to riding on the track, children attend the education to listen to a Safety Education Program. This program teaches children about road safety skills and how to become safe and independent road users, whether they are a cyclist, pedestrian or passenger.

Children are then given a bicycle that suits their size and ability (with or without training wheels) and can begin riding on the track.

Children who are not comfortable with riding can dress up as a crossing supervisor or emergency service personnel.

Sessions last for 90 minutes and include the 20–30-minute safety education session.

Educators or parent helpers supervise children while riding on the track. There is a recommended supervision ratio of 1:6. Kew Traffic School staff also remain onsite to assist.

Public Ride Sessions

Public Play and Ride sessions are available.

These are casual sessions which allow children to experience Kew Traffic School without being part of a school or kindergarten group.

There is no safety education program included in these sessions.


Sessions are available during school holidays (excluding public holidays) and are available for two age groups:

- children aged up to 6 years
- children aged 2 to 10 years.

Children need to bring their own bicycle, tricycle or scooter, as well as their helmets.

Bookings are essential. Kew Traffic School staff have a list of attendees prior to each session and names are ticked off as children enter the gates.

Sessions last for 90 minutes.

Private Bookings

Kew Traffic School is a popular venue for private parties and functions.

Sessions are available for:

- one 2-hour session on weekday afternoons (3-hour sessions during daylight savings)
- four 2-hour sessions on Saturdays and Sundays.

Visitors have exclusive use of the track, party room and adjoining outdoor undercover area during their private booking.

There is a booklet inside the party room which provides all the information the host requires about using the facilities during a private function, including emergency phone numbers.

Kew Traffic School staff are not in attendance during private bookings.

An email is sent out to private function hosts prior to the session with a code to gain entry. Hosts are

required to put the code into the keypad next to the main or secondary entrance gates.

The main entry keypad is at a height of 1080mm AFFL.

The secondary entry keypad is at a height of 1240mm AFFL.

Community groups within the City of Boroondara can also book Kew Traffic School for fundraising events at a discounted rate.

Traffic Control

- Guests can only access the site during the designated booking time.
- Hosts can access the site 15
 minutes prior to and 15 minutes
 after the booking time for set up and
 pack up.
- Children need to bring their own bicycle, tricycle or scooter, as well as their helmet.
- The maximum number of children per private booking is 30 (aged 2-10 years) or 50 (aged 6 years and under).
- Parents and carers must stay and actively supervise their children during the session.

Party Room

The party room is located immediately past the entry gates, to the right.

Entry to the party room is through:

- manual door opening inward with a clearance of 860mm
- manual sliding door with a clearance of 1990mm
- manual sliding door with a clearance of 2060mm.

Includes:

- tables
- stools with no back or armrests
- fridge/freezer
- microwave
- hot and cold-water tap
- oven (no stove top).



Accessibility

Throughout

- Accessible website.
- Boroondara Customer Service is Relay Service Friendly. Calls can be put through to Kew Traffic School.
- Path one from Grange Road footpath to secondary entrance length 4 metres with gradient 1:10 (10%).
- Path two from Grange Road footpath to secondary entrance length 8.5 metres with gradient 1:83 (1.2%)
- Clear path of travel from outdoor to indoor areas.
- Exit button main entry gates 1480mm AFFL.
- Exit button secondary entry gates 1440mm FFFL.
- Varied external terrain of grass, artificial grass, concrete, and asphalt.
- Varied internal terrain of carpet and lino.
- Wide, clear internal and external walkways.
- Clear wheelchair circulation space.
- Spaces for a person using a wheelchair to sit with friends.
- Storage available for mobility aids in education room or party room.
- Pram and scooter parking available on request.
- Quiet space can be provided in the education room.

- Pen and paper available for exchanging information.
- Assistance animals welcome.
- Three bikes available for riders with additional needs.

Track

- Very slight gradient changes throughout.
- Surrounding picnic table heights 750mm AFFL.
- Surrounding track with small step down from concrete to grassed areas.
- Water fountain near female toilet at 800mm AFFL.
- Bike pump near bike shed with hose grab height 520mm AFFL and pump grab height 670mm AFFL.
- Cubby houses with small step at entry.
- Cubby house doors open outward with a clearance of 590mm.
- Mini tram with stepped entry and open clearance of 800mm.
- Petrol station with petrol bowser grab height 600mm AFFL.
- Mini train ramp with stepped access.
- Mini train ramp clearance 800mm.
- Mini train with open entrance clearances of 500mm and 800mm.
- Church with door opening inward with clearance 680mm.


- Telephone box with small step at entry.
- Telephone box open entry with clearance 460mm.
- Telephone grab height 920mm AFFL.

Party Room

- Table heights 730mm AFFL with knee clearance 700mm AFFL.
- Kitchen counter 900mm AFFL.
- Fridge handle 1100mm AFFL, freezer handle 600mm AFFL.
- Microwave 700mm AFFL.
- Hot and cold water tap 950mm AFFL.
- Oven 640mm AFFL.

Outdoor Area

- Bench table heights 900mm AFFL with knee clearance 820mm AFFL.
- Barbecue operating height 1000mm AFFL.
- Aqua fill water fountain heights 650mm AFFL, 760mm AFFL and 1070mm AFFL.



Safety

Throughout

- Venue fully fenced.
- Parents and carers must actively supervise children at all times.
- Riders must wear helmets while on the track.
- Riders are requested to be respectful of other track users, watch their speed and obey traffic signals and lights.
- Drug, alcohol and tobacco free venue.
- Glass bottles and other glass items are prohibited.
- Wet floor signage may be displayed.
- All staff have current Working with Children Checks.
- · Evacuation maps located throughout the venue.
- First aid kit in the party room and kitchenette (staff only).
- Defibrillator available in the party room at 1600mm AFFL.
- · Accessible emergency exits.

- In the event of an emergency during staff hours, staff will help and direct visitors. If there is to be an evacuation, visitors will be directed to the nearest exit and designated assembly area.
- The designated assembly area is the car park or the park next door.

Toilets

- Accessible and ambulant toilets with raised door trim strip.
- Pathway from education room to accessible and ambulant toilets with slight gradient change.

Track


- Walking paths with low edging.
- · Concrete pathway to mini train ramp with no edging.
- Ramp to mini train with single handrail.
- No climbing on top of the mini tram and train.

Education Room

- Mat outside entry doors, colour contrasted to ground.
- Wooden, raised edging on floor upon entry.

Party Room

- Inward opening entry door with contrast safety bands 980mm to 1070mm AFFL.
- Sliding entry doors and surrounding panels with contrast safety bands 990mm to 1065mm AFFL.
- Visitors for private bookings are requested to bring their own first aid kit.
