Last chance to have your say on Camberwell Junction plan

Camberwell Junction is the heart of the Junction Ward neighbourhood, but it's also an important activity centre for Boroondara and Melbourne more widely – for shopping, employment, public transport, services and housing. Its popularity is growing and more residents in the future will call it home.

Our draft Camberwell Junction Structure and Place Plan aims to ensure the centre is a great place to visit, shop, work and live. You can have your say on the draft plan up until 5 pm on Monday 11 December at Engage Boroondara.

By preparing a Structure and Place Plan, Council can guide the design and scale of new development, while protecting the character and heritage of the centre that locals love. The draft plan also identifies targeted improvements to public spaces, transport infrastructure and community facilities that will support the growing centre and make it more attractive to visitors.

To do this, we've taken the 6 Junctionwide priorities the community told us would deliver their vision for the area, and have expanded on them with strategies and actions. We've also defined 6 distinct precincts, such as Fritsch Holzer and Burke Junction, to make the most of each one's opportunities.

All actions aim to improve Camberwell Junction in line with the community's vision of a prosperous, desirable metropolitan destination.

The Victorian Government has recently indicated it intends to introduce planning controls for Camberwell Junction by late 2024. Council does not support this intervention as this Structure and Place Plan has already been drafted and is informed by extensive research and community input. We will continue to work with state departments as we believe this plan will deliver the best outcomes for this precinct.

Local Scouts achieve peak award

Two Junction Ward teenagers have hiked, biked, climbed, paddled, planned and led their way to achieving the peak award for Venturer Scouts.

Josh Welch, 17, and Henry Shirrefs, 18, were recently presented with Queen's Scout awards.

It was the culmination of multiple achievements across about 3 years. As well as advancing in a wide variety of outdoor adventure skills, they each took part in and led activities with their peers, completed 6 personal projects, undertook a leadership course, and planned and led an 'adventurous journey' for fellow Venturers. For this, Josh organised a 4-day hike at Gariwerd/Grampians in Victoria's west, and Henry a 4-day bike hike around Port Phillip Bay, starting and finishing at their 2nd/6th Hawthorn Scout Group hall in Victoria Road in Hawthorn East.

Group Leader Marcus Shirrefs, Henry's father, says the group has seen only 20 King's or Queen's Scout awards across the past 81 years. "To have 2 in close

succession is a great achievement," he says.

"We recently commissioned some honour boards for the group which we unveiled at the award ceremony for the boys so we're able to display the full history in our hall."

The 2nd/6th Hawthorn Scout group has around 75 youth members across Joeys, Cubs, Scouts and Venturers. They have 12 volunteer leaders and are always looking for more help or volunteers.

The City of Boroondara supports Scouts through the Community Strengthening Grants program and providing Council land for many Boroondara Scouts buildings.

On a sad note for local Scouts, Boroondara resident Lord Michael Baden-Powell, grandson of Scouts founder Lord Robert Baden-Powell, passed away recently. He was strongly involved with the Scouts movement in Australia and beyond.

Update: soft plastic recycling service

We launched our temporary soft plastic recycling service in late July to fill the gap left by the collapse of the REDcycle program. Thank you to all residents who have embraced this new service and contributed positively to the environment by doing so.

In its first 3 months we had an estimated 2,850 visits across our 2 collection points, at the Boroondara Recycling and Waste Centre (648 Riversdale Road, Camberwell) and the Kew Depot Recycling Drop-off Centre (31-35 Hutchinson Drive, Kew).

We encourage residents to continue dropping off small household amounts of unavoidable soft plastics for recycling. Check the web page below to ensure there's capacity at the collection point.

We accept plastic bags, food packets/ wrappers and bubble wrap. Items like plastic bottles/containers, cling wrap, biscuit trays and cellophane are not accepted through this service.
